SOCIAL STRUCTURE

Wild: Mostly found in pairs or family units, occasionally flocks have been documented up to 10 birds but this is rare.

AZA: Minimum of a pair, best kept in flocks of 4-10. Breedinbg is most successful with only 2-3 pairs in the exhibit.

Minimum Group Size: 1.1

Maximum Group Size: As large of a flock the facility can accommodate.
